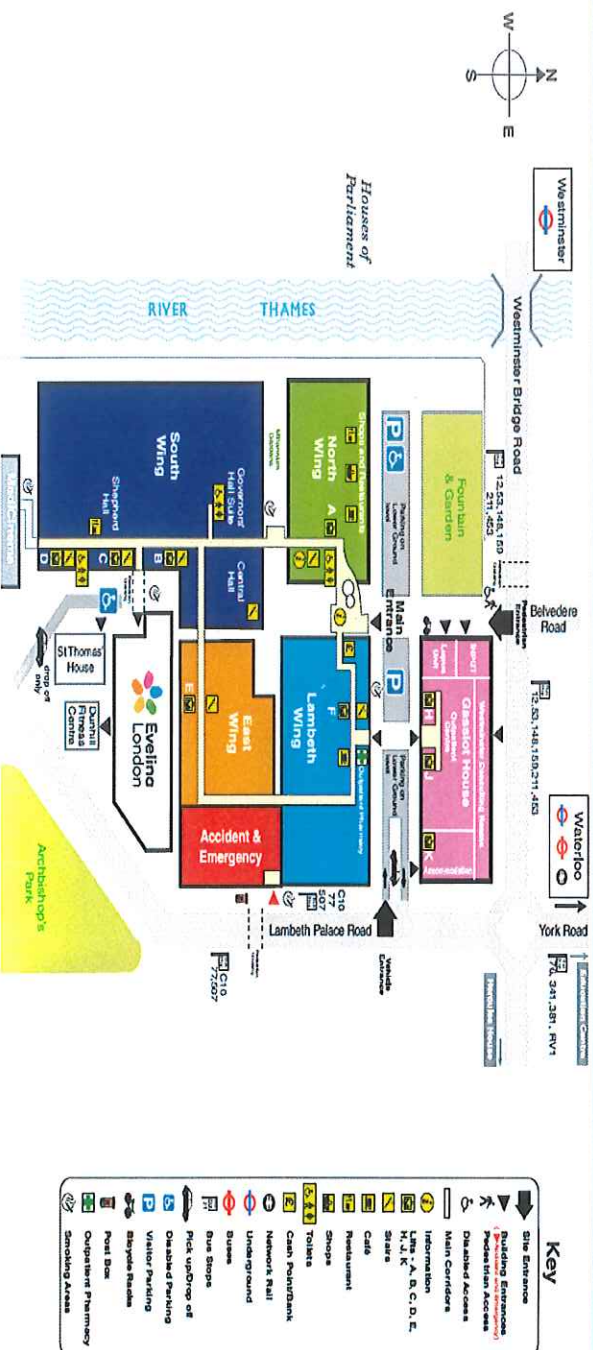

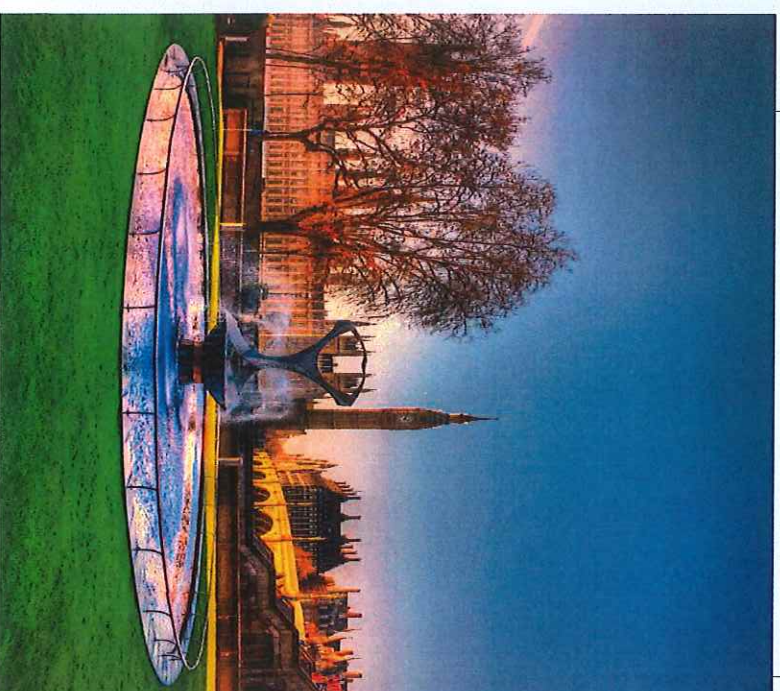

Guy's & St Thomas' is one of the largest NHS Trusts in the UK, with over 14,000 staff; an annual turnover of more than £1.2 billion; and 1.6 million patient contacts a year.

The Critical Care Department is one of the largest in the UK, consisting of more than 80 beds. The Intensive care unit has over 70 beds with 57+ beds on the St Thomas' site & 13+ on the Guy's site. In December, 2018, a new 11-bed ICU will be opening. This unit, has a focus on severe respiratory failure and patients with high-consequence infectious diseases. Our staff rotate through all of our intensive care units. This allows our staff to gain a broad range of experience, to enable them to care for a variety of critically ill patients.

Our patients are admitted from a range of specialties, including medicine & surgery, cardiac, haematology, vascular, thoracics, renal, and ENT.

As a tertiary referral centre, it is nationally and internationally renowned for its services, with advanced therapies including renal replacement therapy, plasma exchange, advanced respiratory and ventilatory support such as ECMO (Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation).
